E. Guidelines and Forms

Golf Cart Rules and Registration



- 1. Golf cart use on the common roads of Oakledge is permitted subject to the rules and regulations enumerated below.
- 2. Each golf cart owner is required to register with the Association their golf cart(s) and to supply the Association with the form required below for registration. Upon such registration the Owner shall be issues a registration decal. Such registration(s) shall be valid for three years from date of issuance.
- 3. Each golf cart owner shall have appropriate insurance which covers losses arising from the use of their golf cart. The Association recommends that you obtain a separate insurance policy for your golf cart. The typical homeowners' policy only provides coverage for a golf car when it is used to service your property or for recreational riding at your residence. You may not have any coverage once your golf car leaves your property. Check with your insurance provider to be sure.
- 4. The Association shall not have any liability for damages to property or person caused by or arising from the ownership, operation or storage of the owner's golf cart. The use of a golf cart on the common roads of Oakledge constitutes a waiver by the golf cart owner releasing the Association of any responsibility and liability from damages caused in any way by use of the golf cart. It further constitutes an agreement by the owner of the golf cart to indemnify and hold harmless the Association for any costs incurred by the Association relating to or arising from the use of the golf cart.
- 5. Except in an emergency, no golf cart repairs are to be carried out on the common roads or property of Oakledge.
- 6. Golf carts driven in the evening hours or during times of low visibility must be equipped with both headlights and taillights.
- 7. Pedestrians and bicycles shall, at all times be given due consideration and reasonable right of way.

- 8. Golf carts should always drive to the far-right side of the road, allowing licensed motor vehicles the ability to pass safely on the left.
- 9. At a minimum, all golf carts should be equipped with efficient brakes, safe tires, and all lights, mirrors, and signals. If not equipped with signal, the use of standard hand signals is mandatory.
- 10. Nothing shall be pulled behind a golf cart for any reason.
- 11. The Association reserves the right to enforce and act upon all rules governing the use of any golf cart within the Community, including but not limited to towing at the golf cart owners' expense.
